RSS is one of those very simple technologies that enables all sorts of interesting activities within the library. In this talk, we will start with the basics of what RSS is and how it can be used within a library setting. Included will be demonstrations of tools for embedding RSS feeds in a web page, creating RSS feeds, and ways to build RSS into everything [online] the library does. It can be a powerful tool for building connections between the library and its patrons -- without the patrons knowing it.
