**NEW: "Building Community by Welcoming Diversity," Thursday, July 6, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Science & Engineering Library, Room 090:** This full-day, interactive participatory workshop designed to promote awareness and increase sensitivity to enhance awareness and increase sensitivity to the many similarities and differences among groups and individuals in our society. The workshop helps participants to:

- \* Celebrate their similarities and differences;
- \* Identify the misinformation that they have learned about other groups;
- \* Recognize the internalized negative feelings and behaviors that they direct towards members of their own groups;
- \* Claim pride in their own group identities;
- \* Learn about the personal impact of discrimination through the telling of stories, and
- \* Gain empowerment by learning concrete tools for effectively interrupting prejudicial remarks, jokes, slurs and behaviors.

The workshop is being facilitated by Patrick Hall, Michelle Jacobson and Shakeer Abdullah, the university's representatives to the National Coalition Building Institute. There is no charge for the session, but registration for the catered lunch being provided at the session.
