



Dear Jake,

It's about 1½ pounds (.68 kg) per person per day. In North America, we use about 600 pounds of paper per person per year. In Japan the number is slightly lower at around 550 pounds (250 kg) per year.

That's 5 to 6 trees per person per year ground up into paper.

But this is about more than just trees. Less paper use means a lot less pollution and less energy waste. These things still matter, even though we don't hear much about ecology anymore.



Making recycled paper creates only 26% of the air pollution that making virgin paper makes.


So buy less stuff. Buy less packaging. All those little tiny packages of stuff for just one use are, if you'll excuse me, stupid.
