About 45 to 50 people crowded into a classroom in Pressey Hall yesterday to voice their fears and concerns about the bioresearch lab planned for construction in Fred Beekman Park.

A team of university administrators was present to answer questions from the group, which included Ohio State personnel, students and residents of Upper Arlington. Also present were two of the researchers who will be working in the new facility.

The strongest concerns were for the potential health threat to park users and occupants of Pressey Hall should any organisms escape from the lab.

Despite reassurances from the university that the facility will be safe, occupants of Pressey Hall were concerned about the proximity of infectious pathogens to young children. Pressey Hall houses the Speech & Hearing Center, as well as a licensed preschool for children with language and hearing impediments.

"You're telling us about things that will 'never happen.' I'm sure if you had told someone in the Murrah Federal Building someone would drive a fertilizer truck up and blow it up, they would say 'it would never happen,'" said Gail Whitelaw, director of clinic instruction and research.

Marcia Taber is a clinical supervisor in the speech-language-hearing clinic and the director of the LEAP preschool. She said she is concerned the preschool will lose its license when the new lab is built.

"As a licensed preschool, I have certain state regulations I have to abide by," Taber said.

She said the state inspects the preschool once or twice per year,

Study:
drinking
slows in
stages

And the survey says...college students are curbing their drinking habits before graduation.

Kenneth Steinman, assistant professor of health behavior at Ohio State, has released his findings from a study focusing on college students' drinking norms.

"I was interested in understanding how common it was for students who drink heavily to stop before they graduate," Steinman said. "There have been studies that show when students graduate, marry and start careers their drinking habits change, but I was interested in factors associated with changes in drinking habits before these things occur."

Steinman's study surveyed 778 undergraduates from OSU. The students were selected by their responses to a survey and then placed into four categories based on their responses. The categories represent stages that each student is at in the process of cutting down their alcohol consumption.

Precontemplation is the first stage. During precontemplation, a student will drink heavily with no intention of changing their habits.

Contemplation follows. Here a student realizes they are drinking heavily and is thinking about changing their consumption patterns.

During the Action phase, a student has stopped their heavy drinking habits, if only temporarily.

The final stage of curbing heavy drinking is maintenance. This is

"Those in charge of planning and organizing this year's fair have tried to focus on Ohio's history, as well as the history of the fair," said Minier.

Fair food and beverages are a great reason to come out, and if you are thirsty for an enormous iced-tea, OSU alum Jim Dawson is the man to see. Coming from Las Vegas, Dawson and his family, run five iced-tea and lemonade drink stands all over the nation.

"I've been a part-time carnay for about four years, and I love all the people I get to meet," Dawson said.

A refreshing drink will really hit the spot after trying some of the new food entrees such as batter-dipped Twinkies, cheese-flavored beetle larvae or chocolate-dipped insects.

Abelson, Bow Wow among the many
artists providing affordable entertainment

Its made from a trapezoidal piece of rosewood, its name means sweet song and playing it is like opening up a piano and banging on the strings.

Matthew Abelson will be entertaining crowds with a blend of Irish and American traditional music, jazz and original compositions played on the hammered dulcimer at The Ohio State Fair. Abelson's performance highlights the variety of music fairgoers will be able to experience this year.

"I like bouncing off the walls when I play," Abelson said. "I like having a good time."

One of the most notable characteristics of his performance is the high energy, he said.

"I have a reputation for playing very fast," Abelson said.

Abelson, a resident of Cleveland, often performs in coffee shops, but is no stranger to the outdoor concert atmosphere the fair provides. Catching the attention of curious crowds is something he has experienced during time spent as a street performer in New Orleans.

"I'll be playing in The Gazebo," he said. "So this time I'll actually have a stage."

The Gazebo is one of five free stages that will be home to a number of musical acts performing daily

throughout the duration of the fair.

Abelson will be playing three shows a day during the opening week. He said he plans to bring a variety of rhythm instruments to hand out among the crowds, so they can play along with him.

"There's definitely audience interaction," he said. "It's truly a family show. It's something kids and the parents can both enjoy."

This is Abelson's second year at the Ohio State Fair, but the first time he will be giving multiple performances. Segments of story telling and humor in between songs will keep the audience interested and make every show a little different, he said.

"What started out as little anecdotes, have turned into bits," he said. "I'm really looking forward to it."

On the opposite end of the musical spectrum, national acts, including hip hop star and Columbus native Bow Wow, will be performing in the 10,200 capacity Celeste Center.

"Our main focus is on value and diversity," said Christina Minier, spokeswoman for The Ohio State Fair.

including the surrounding environment and is unsure how the state will react to the presence of a BSL-3 lab.

Taber is also the author of Pressey Hall's emergency procedures plan and said the plan will have to be rewritten to anticipate pathogens escaping from the lab.

"If something happens, the whole building will be contaminated," she said. "How can I protect these kids until their parents can come get them?"

Taber is also concerned the clinic will lose patients because people will be too scared to come into the building. The clinic is financially self-supporting and relies on its patients for revenue.

Taber said she is most upset that the university failed to consult with the occupants of Pressey Hall before making plans for construction of the new facility.

"No one looked at what we do in this building. That wasn't considered at all," she said. "Talk about lack of respect for what we do. They didn't even know we were here."

During the meeting, Laura Shinn, a senior campus planner, said the university had not talked to anyone in Pressey Hall about its plans for the lab.

"That was a flaw in the process," she said.

Taber was unimpressed with promises that Pressey's occupants will be informed as the pro-

ject progresses.

"Our experience with university assurances that policies and procedures will be followed is not very good," she said. "I support the research, but I don't support their lack of insight into the placement of this facility."

Larry Schlesinger, director of the new facility, said research projects will include studies of tuberculosis and tularemia. Anthrax and corona viruses, such as SARS, may also be studied in the new lab.

Schlesinger previously supervised a Level 3 lab at the University of Iowa. He emphasized research in the new building will not pose a risk to the community.

"I don't envision any organism ever escaping from this facility," he said.

Researchers will be required to undergo a rigorous process of proving they are qualified to work in biosafety level 3 facilities and to handle Category A pathogens, such as tularemia. That process will be supervised by a new eight-member committee overseeing BSL-3 facilities on campus.

Schlesinger and Cecil Smith, OSU's institutional biosafety officer, will both sit on the committee along with a representative from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

The committee was formed to comply with guidelines set forth by the National Institute for Health.

The NIH requires the committee contain representatives from the surrounding community, in addition to university faculty and administrators, Smith said.

Researchers will also have to pass a security screening by the FBI and be approved by the Center for Disease Control to work with dangerous pathogens, Smith said.

Schlesinger said the research conducted in the Beekman Park facility will be asking basic questions about how infectious diseases work and potentially developing vaccines.

Joanne Turner will be conducting research on Tuberculosis. Turner, who worked at Colorado State University, said the researchers will be working almost exclusively with treatable diseases.

"I value my health above anything else. I truly believe my daily work isn't dangerous," she said.

Director of Research Communications Earle Holland said the university has no interest in seeking classified research projects. Weapons research is prohibited by the university's charter, he said.

In response to concerns from the group about future research projects, Schlesinger said the university will not pursue level 4 bioresearch.

"The stuff you see in the movies where people wear space suits and study ebola is very popularized," he said. "OSU has no plans for that."

BEYOND THE BUILDING
Lord Hall

It has been the victim of two fires, discussed for its inaccessibility and threatened to be demolished more than once. Lord Hall, though, remains standing as a historical reminder of the early days of the Ohio State campus.

Completed in 1906 and originally called the School of Mines Building, Lord Hall was designed by architect Frank L. Packard. There is a discrepancy in the total cost of the building as it has been listed as \$114,615.83 and \$128,864.15.

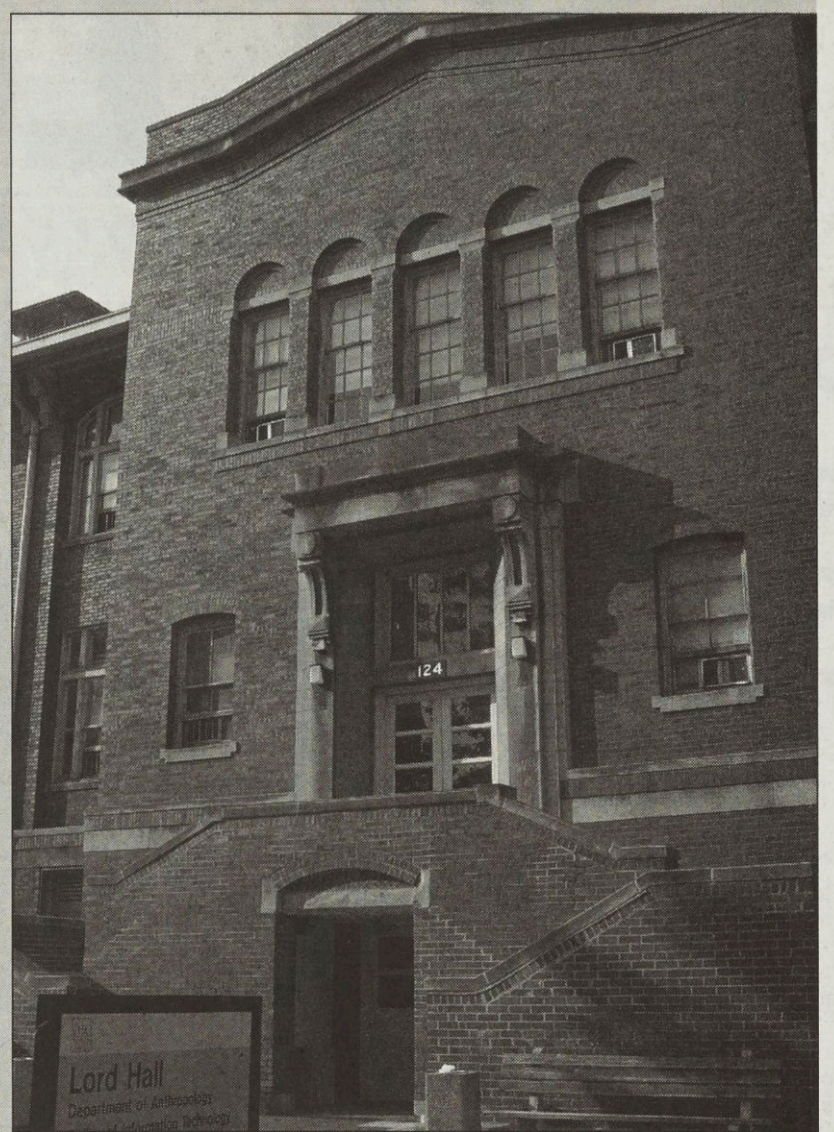
In 1918, a new two-story section was added to the building at a cost of \$24,172.20. Another addition was made in 1940 to extend the first floor, costing an additional \$39,980 for the university.

The building was renamed Lord Hall in 1912 in honor of Nathaniel Wright Lord, the first dean of the College of Engineering and the first director of the School of Mines. Lord worked at OSU for 35 years before he died of heart failure on May 23, 1911.

Shortly after Lord's death, a petition surfaced to rename the mines building after him. Lord's sister, Caroline, an artist, was asked to paint a portrait of her brother to hang in the newly renamed building. A bronze plaque was made to dedicate the building to Lord, and, in fact, still hangs in Lord Hall.

Lord Hall, made of wood and brick and listed as not fire proof in the OSU archives, has caught fire twice. The first was in 1959 when a painter's cloth fell onto a light bulb that was left on overnight. This fire caused considerable damage to the third floor, and other parts of the building suffered water and smoke damage. The cost for repairs was reported as \$170,000.

The second fire occurred on May

4, 1970 when a firebomb was thrown into the building during protests against the Vietnam War. The university's printing facilities were inside the building, and the fire damaged photocopy equipment.

Lord Hall has faced a worse fate than fire damage though. The building has been listed for demolition for years because it is inaccessible. The process of updating the building would cost the university more than if the university

were to completely destroy it. The building does not have an elevator for handicapped students and faculty to use.

It remains unknown when or if Lord Hall is slated for demolition.

Today, the building is home to the Department of Anthropology. It also is used as extra space for any department needing more room.

Lord Hall, at least for now, still remains standing as an example of early OSU.

when a student has stopped drinking heavily and has avoided excessive alcohol use for a minimum of six months.


"It's not uncommon in students that we classified as heavy episodic drinkers to stop," Steinman said. "One in four collegiate heavy

drinkers may be stopping at least temporarily before they graduate."

The results of Steinman's study showed that at least a third of his test subjects had stopped drinking or had significantly cut back on the amount of alcohol they consume.

"If we can figure out why these

students have cut back, maybe we can help create preventative programs that are more effective," Steinman said. "I hope that my study will enable the Student Wellness Center to continue to improve their efforts to encourage students to stop heavy drinking."



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Seguignol helps lead Clippers to victory

The Columbus Clippers (53-59) continue to have problems fielding the ball, but managed to hold off the Charlotte Knights (54-57) for a 6-5 victory, thanks to a strong offensive output yesterday.

Designated hitter Fernando Seguignol led the offense right off the bat in the first inning, with a two-run home run. Seguignol was named the International League batter of the week for July 21 through last Sunday. This is the second time he has received the award this season, also winning it on July 7. The 6-foot-5-inch, 230-pound switch hitter is an 11-year pro, with a batting average of .362, 11 home runs and 28 RBI so far in July. At age 28, he is second in both on-base percentage and batting average in the league.

"Day by day I do what I can do to slowly come back and help the team in any way that I can," Seguignol said.

Seguignol was placed on the disabled list April 30 with a quad injury. Since his return June 8, he has helped a defensively plagued Clippers team to come together offensively and pull out some wins.

"The team is really starting to unite and gel together," Seguignol said. "Guys will do anything to win, and that is what we need."

Clippers manager Bucky Dent is pleased with the play of Seguignol in the designated hitter spot coming off of an injury.

"Right now I like him in the DH — designated hitter — spot. He is hitting the ball very well right now for us," Dent said.

Dent said if they need to they can put a glove on Seguignol and put him just about anywhere on the field. Seguignol's natural position is first base, but he played in left field throughout spring training.

On a scorching day in their second game of a two-game series against the Knights, the Clippers had four errors that led to two unearned runs. The Clippers lost the first matchup with the Knights 5-2 Tuesday. In the series, the Clippers had a combined seven errors.

"Errors cost us the game the other night against Charlotte, and fortunately today, we were able to pitch our way out of them," Dent said.

The Clippers' pitchers did not walk a single batter while the Knights walked four.

Despite fielding poorly, the Clippers had many missed opportunities to score, leaving nine runners stranded on base for the game.

The Clippers were tied 4-4 going into the seventh inning, when the game was broken open by Clippers' shortstop Erik Almonte who, going into the game, was batting .239, with nine home runs and 28 RBIs. Holding the Knights scoreless in the top of the seventh, the Clippers took the lead off of Almonte's double that scored two runs. Almonte then advanced to third on an errant throw to the plate. The Clippers never trailed again during the game.

"The last few games have not been too pretty, but a win is a win and we'll take it," Dent said.

Clarett caught in another investigation by the NCAA

Ohio State tailback Maurice Clarett is the center of another NCAA investigation. University athletic officials said yesterday he is under scrutiny in regards to stolen items from a car he was driving.

The investigation recently got under way, despite a report being filed by Clarett to university police

in April.

Director of Athletics Andy Geiger told the Associated Press it's not unusual for the NCAA to inquire about these type of expenses.

The expenses in question are about \$6,165 worth of stolen goods out of the 2001 Chevrolet Monte Carlo Clarett was driving. According to the police report, the car was parked in the east lot of Woody

Hayes Athletic Center. The front passenger window was shattered and the trunk lock was punched out.

Clarett reported two built-in television monitors, stereo equipment, \$800 cash, \$300 in clothing and 300 compact discs stolen.

The NCAA held meetings with Clarett earlier this month to talk about the police report.

There is question to whether Clarett's relationship to Lebron

James has a part in the monetary value he was carrying in the car.

Geiger admitted to the AP the stolen property is part of the reason for the NCAA investigation.

"It's a piece of it, but not the sole cause of their coming," he said. "It's part of what we're talking to them about."

The case has since been closed by university police. None of the items reported were ever found.

Hassenboehler and Ball will perform a pas de deux (duet) from Ben Stevenson's "Sleeping Beauty," and van der Wyst and Go will

'Straits' captures new sound

In 1991, music fans were left wanting more from the artists that gave them classic albums such as "Ritual De Lo Habitual" and "Nothing's Shocking," but were left only with want and a farewell tour that launched the iconic Lollapalooza festival.

This was the temporary end of Jane's Addiction, but after a long hiatus, they have finally returned with their first full-length album with all new material since the split.

"Straits" is the title of the newest installment in the collection of works that has defined Jane's Addiction. It is the graceful landing onto the next stage of their career from the seemingly infinite jump from their previous stage.

The album was produced by famed producer Bob Ezrin, who formerly worked with acts such as Pink Floyd and Alice Cooper.

"Straits" marks the group's first collaboration since 1996, when Dave Navarro and Flea (Red Hot Chili Peppers) joined together with Perry Farrell and drummer Stephen Perkins in their band Porno for Pyros. The group recorded two albums and were featured on various collections including the "Private Parts" soundtrack.

The group was officially back together in 1997, and played a few venues and released two new songs along with other reworked songs. They eventually separated again to work on other projects, but then got back together in 2001.

On "Straits," the band features Perry Farrell on vocals, Dave Navarro on the guitar, Stephen Perkins on the drums and a new bass player, Chris Chaney.

The chemistry of this new line-up is magnificent. The band's natural blend of indie-rock, progressive-rock, folk and punk is the quenching that many thirsty ears have been needing.

The album starts out with a partial wind up and then a quick release. The guitar riffs of Dave Navarro begin the pulse of the album and the vocals of Perry Farrell give it life. The first song, "True Nature," is a soft, smooth introduction with a hard edge that is very reminiscent of previous Jane's Addiction releases. It fits perfectly as the opening act to their opus.

The album continues on with its second song, the title track, "Straits." It is a song that shows the wonderful range of the band. The song transitions from a slow pace to a fast pace going almost undetected.

The album's first single, "Just Because," is the third track. It has the excitement and catchy sound that

many fans will enjoy. It is a little more mellow than other songs from the band's past, like "Been Caught Stealing" from the "Ritual De Lo Habitual" album. But this is not the sign of a burnt out band; it is a sign of wisdom and maturity.

This idea of musically evolutionary growth is true for most of the "Straits" album. Songs like "Suffer Some" display Navarro's depth as a guitarist swinging from the melodic riffs that might be heard in a Metallica song to the eerie sounding riffs of Marilyn Manson guitarist John 5. The No. 10 track on the album is called "Hypersonic." It adds a punk edge to the album as it drops in with fast vocals and faster drums.

The album finishes with a song that sounds as if it was written just to close the album. "To Match the Sun" starts the way a Cure song would start with the sound of synthesizers and a soft voice, but then it morphs directly into a sound that is much rawer, a sound similar to that of a revamped INXS.

"Straits" is a success for Jane's Addiction. Their new sound is derivative of their own classic beauty. This, plus the fact they are headlining Lollapalooza again in 2003, proves that they have exactly the same magic they had 13 years ago, and are showing no sign of relinquishing it.

'Wedding' sickens, amuses

"American Wedding" is a celebration of the human body. No, it is a celebration of everything that comes out of the human body. It also pays tribute to the topless dominatrix, sex with the geriatric, shaved male genitals and, of course, the accidental ingestion of fecal matter mistaken for chocolate. Does it sound like something your 12-year-old nephew would find hilarious? It probably is.

The third installment in the "American Pie" gross out saga begins with a proposal. Jim Levinstein (Jason Biggs) asks Michelle Flaherty (Alyson Hannigan) to marry him while in a posh restaurant after an embarrassing public oral sex mishap. The kind of thing we all can relate to. Jim's father (Eugene Levy) has come to the restaurant to bring his son the ring, and walks in at a most inopportune time. Levy is the brightest spot in this film as Jason's comically understanding father who doles out loving sex advice to his son sprinkled with his own personal details involving Jason's mother.

The rest of the movie is the standard pre-wedding comedy with a few vulgar twists. Imagine a combination of "Father of the Bride," "Animal House" and "Three's Company" and this should paint a pretty clear picture of how the film was scripted. Each situation — much like the '70s television program "Three's Company" — is so contrived, it borders on the absurd. To make many of the scenes believable, one must suspend disbelief and shut down the rational side of the brain. One must also suspend the gag reflex.

Seann William Scott returns to his role as Stifler, the obnoxious friend who won't go away. Most of the films gags are carried by the foul-mouthed, emotionally underdeveloped Stifler. The jock-turned-high school football coach spews his homophobic and misogynist expletive, and the cast looks on in disbelief. He manages to come off as a likeable character because it is evident his macho posturing and foul mouth are a mask to hide the insecurities just beneath the surface. This isn't revealed by good acting, though. It is revealed partially through accident and the viewer's experience with these types in daily life. Acting is almost absent from the film. The dialogue used to set up each elaborate gag is forced and the director, Jesse Dylan, obviously saw this as a secondary element, which took a back seat to the staging of each joke.

What is left for the viewer in the absence of drama and believability, you ask? A heap of crude jokes. But the series has made no pretensions of being anything more than a crude

joke factory, and it does this masterfully. By the end of "American Wedding," the characters have had at least one comedic accident with every fluid that can be extracted from the human body, the act of coitus has been described in ways hitherto unknown and with the infamous apple pie scene, a film trilogy has finally outdone the "Porky's" shower hole scene.

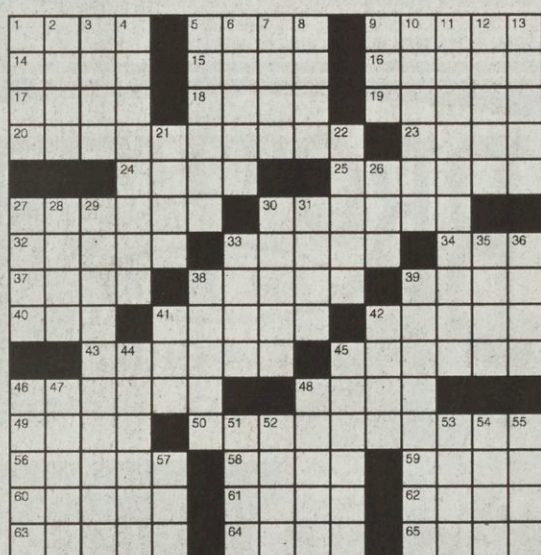
The ongoing feud between Stifler and Finch (Eddie Kaye Thomas) is rekindled and this is another bright spot in the film as the two battle for the affection of Michelle's attractive sister who has come to take part as a member of the wedding party.

The film lacks the freshness of the original, and at times it seems as if too much of the script is carried by a single character — Stifler. Like horror films, it is often the case in a comedy sequel that the script becomes an afterthought and the jokes are cranked up to compensate. This could explain some of the weakness in this movie. The gross out factor is still high, and on this level, the film should not disappoint.
