It was under the "Dream Of A Rarebit Fiend" title 6/27-6/28/11, then "Midsummer Day Dreams" 6/29-9/5/11, then "It Was Only A Dream" for the rest of the run, except for occasional strips titled "Dream Of A Lobster Fiend" 2/2/12-5/7/12.
