This feature only ran 01/17/1909-04/18/1909 according to strippers guide. These dates are most likely reprints.												
3 undated examples of this feature for 1911 are held in the collection in Box SFS112-1-8, SFS112-2-(1, 4). The run of Sundays for these years has been kept in the original order in which it was received from the San Francisco Academy of Comic Art. The range of these undated features is most likely February-May, 1911.												
Note: Aug 7, 1911, is the written date by Bill Blackbeard on the stockton evening mail, and is marked as such even as that is not a Sunday date. It was most likely August 6, 1911.
